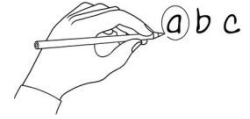




Have got - ANSWERS

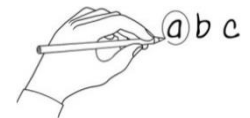
Read and circle true or false for these sentences.

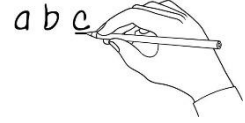

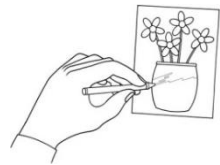
