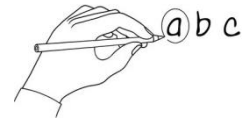




Prepositions of time

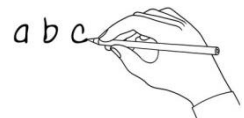

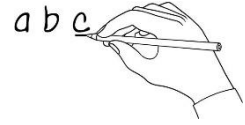

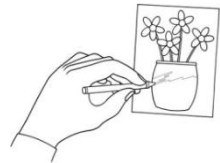
