


# Learn**English Kids**

### The super jobs - ANSWERS AND GUIDANCE

#### 1. Match them up!

Read and point to each word. Encourage your child/children to identify the picture and draw a line. Get them to repeat after you say the word.







Read Pam's spelling rules together with your child/children. Highlight the relationship between the spellings and the sounds. Make the sounds of the letter combinations (e.g. 'ch') and point to and say the words (e.g. chickens). Encourage your child/children to repeat. Emphasize how the sound is related to the spelling of word by blending the sounds together while pointing at the letter(s) making the sounds.

### 2. Find the spelling!

Let your child/children look at the words and identify all the tricky spellings they can. Encourage them to look back at Pam's spelling rules above if necessary. Give encouragement and help where needed.

I explain things in a school and help children find the right answers.

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
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#### 3. Match them up!

First help your child/children to match the jobs with the sentences. Refer your child/children back to the previous exercises or the story if necessary. Then ask your child to complete the words with the spellings from the box. Ask them to make the sound of the spelling and then to say the word, helping them to 'blend' the sounds in the word together if necessary. For any words they don't know, say the word slowly and clearly, and encourage them to identify the missing sound and how it might be spelled. Give lots of praise and encouragement.

#### 4. Write and draw!

Encourage your child to draw a picture and say something about the job, as much or as little as they are able. Help them to write down what they say, highlighting any words which happen to have any of the spellings from Pam's spelling rules above. Give lots of praise and encouragement at all stages.



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
